




Practical English Grammar (Classic Reprint)

Excerpt from Practical English Grammar The purpose of this book is to discuss the elements of English grammar in a clear and simple way, with the end in view of promoting the development of better language habits in the pupil. Grammar as a science is subordinated herein to grammar in its practical aspects. In method and treatment the book is adapted to the grammar grades, but it presupposes an acquaintance with the rudiments of the subject as acquired in connection with language lessons. The formal study of grammar, the author believes, should not begin before the seventh year. The book consists of two main divisions. The aim of Part I is to acquaint the pupil with the sentence in its various relations. Part II deals with the parts of speech in detail. The inductive and laboratory methods are employed. The order of development usually followed is, to begin with an apt and familiar example that produces a definite image or concept, with the accompanying comment or generalization reduced to the simplest and most direct terms; then to follow...
